CALIFORNIA FIRESTORMS

We can and will rebuild, we're stronger together!

As many of you know we're located in Concord (Northern), California and have many client/dog teams, volunteers, supporters, and friends who are impacted by the horrific firestorms. Our thoughts and prayers are with everyone affected by this tragedy. Know you can lean on your Dogs4Diabetics family for anything you might need during this time, just ask. We're stronger together!

D4D Client/Dog Team, Brittany and Izumi, were personally effected by these heartbreaking fires...

"We live in Santa Rosa and were evacuated at 2:30am on October 9th because of the Tubbs Fire. When our apartment complex manager told us that the fire was a mile and a half from our home, we knew we needed to move quickly to get out safely. We had ten minutes to gather the most important items we could and even that was about five minutes too long; by the time I opened the front door to dash down the stairs to my car, the fire was on our property and the smoke was so intense I couldn't see anything. We could feel the heat from the flames and were caught in 80 mph winds that were swirling embers the size of barbeque briquettes over our heads. I froze - I had no idea how I was going to get down the stairs and to the car with Izumi without getting burned.

She jumped into action, channeled all of her training from when she was a Guide Dog pup, and guided me down the stairs and straight to my car through smoke, hurricane force gusts of wind, and falling embers. She was completely unfaltering, rock solid, and exactly what I needed in those precious minutes.

Through the next week and a half of our evacuation, she didn't miss a single alert despite the intense smoke exposure and lack of sleep. On a normal day Izumi amazes me with the ways she keeps me safe and in this extreme circumstance she surpassed any expectations I had.

She even brought comfort to the firefighters that were housed at our evacuation site; a few of them told me that it was because of her unconditional love and fluffiness that they felt able to return to battle the flames day after day. Anyone who knows Izumi knows that she is truly one of a kind, and it's no surprise she brought safety and hope during this time of uncertainty and tragedy. I can't express how grateful I am to have her - she truly is a hero and deserves all of the Zuke treats and medals in the world". - D4D Client, Brittany (and Super Hero Izumi)

"I have been living with diabetes for 62 years (I am sure glad D4D is not named Dogs and Dinosaurs 4 Diabetics), it is only since August 2016 Hale and I became partners. Hale is like a beacon of light. That is, whether alerting on me, at 4:07am or 4:07pm, his bright eyes staring at me means I need to check my blood glucose. And, he will always insist I issue the command "Let's Check". So, not only does he get his reward, but, I too am rewarded with tighter blood glucose control, and with peace of mind knowing he's watching after me.

After a five hour plane trip, the flight attendant told me, "if only all plane passengers were as well behaved as Hale, she might be without a job". I can't thank the Guide Dog Puppy Raisers, D4D Fosters, and the entire D4D team enough for making our life-saving partnership possible.

Recently, Hale and I were visiting a doctor for an annual exam. The doctor was interested in Hale and how he is helping me remain free of long term diabetes related complications.

It is the Dogs4Diabetics family that continues to mean so much to me. While I might be volunteering my time with Scent Training, helping prepare our new facility, or, other D4D activities to say thank you for this gift... the D4D Team, Fosters, Volunteers, and others behind the scenes, simply are the stars. Put another way, it is my entire D4D family (of course including Hale) that are so important to me.

TREATS FROM THE TRAINER... ROAD TRIP!

companion along! Remember, NEVER, leave your pet alone in the car.

Anytime is a great time for an epic road trip with **your pet...** especially when the holidays are right around the corner. But, before you head out here are some tips to make your adventures together even more enjoyable.

Plan your route... you want to ensure that your schedule accommodates time for regular breaks for your pup's physical comfort and happiness. Your dog needs to have the opportunity for potty breaks but also to walk around and experience the new environment. Plan to take a 15 to 30 minute break every 4 hours. You can also make very long trips more enjoyable for both of you if you plan stops at locations with pet-friendly attractions

Get a weather report... this can help you better prepare for issues like rain that could slow your travel, and also to avoid potential natural disasters, such as hurricanes, tornadoes, and floods. Also, take the weather into consideration when packing for your dog. If it's colder than they're used to, you may need to pack some clothing for them too.

Pack a bag for your dog... Separating your dog's things from your items will make them easier to access when you need them on the ride. Consider all the places you will visit along the way when packing. Items you may want to include:

- Your dog's regular food and food bowl
- Water (collapsible food/water bowls are great for travel)
- Medications
- Poop bags
- A collar and leash
- Updated tags
- Medical records and vaccination certificates
- Grooming supplies and a towel
- Kennel
- Dog bed and blankets
- Favorite toys




