
A NEW LIFE-SAVING PARTNERSHIP, ALI & RUBINA

I was diagnosed with Type 1 Diabetes during my second week of kindergarten, at the age of five. From that day forward, my life forever changed. My days became consumed by shots, finger pricks, and watching what I ate. Because of my diabetes and the considerable responsibility that came along with it, I matured at an accelerated rate compared to my classmates, and it

was hard dealing with the unwanted attention from my diabetes. All I wanted was to fit in. Growing up, I felt quite alone because I did not know any other diabetics. I used dance, music, and horseback riding as my outlets. After I graduated high school, I moved six hours north of my hometown, Moorpark, to get a fresh start and attend UC Davis.

During my senior year of college, I completed my classwork at Dogs4Diabetics. I will never forget how I felt on the first day of class. Hearing the constant noises of CGM alerts, beeping pumps, test strip bottles, and finger pricks was like music to my ears! For the first time in my life, I felt like I fit in. I felt "normal" being in a room full of people just like me. I knew I was becoming a part of something special, and I'm still constantly amazed by the dedication of the staff, volunteers, and Canine Training Partners at D4D. Everyone in this organization is committed to improving the lives of diabetics and creating successful partnerships.

I patiently waited for my trial placement, keeping my faith and trusting the D4D staff to pair me with the right dog for me. And they sure did! Rubina has completely changed my life, and it's hard to put into words everything she has done for me. While I knew she would help me with my diabetes, I did not realize the impact she would have on every other aspect of my life. With Rubina by my side, I feel like I can reach my true potential. She gives me confidence, not only with my health but with my whole self. I've earned my Bachelor of Science degree in Forensic Chemistry and moved to LA to work as a Quality Assurance Chemist at a forensic toxicology laboratory, all with Rubina by my side. As I pursue graduate school and the rest of my forensic career, I know that Rubina and D4D will be there for me. I cannot thank Dogs4Diabetics enough for blessing me with Rubina and the amazing friendships I have made. Thanks to you all, I have a second chance at life and a new outlook on my diabetes. Dogs4Diabetics is truly a family that every diabetic deserves to experience.


Each section of our 2018 Annual Report thoughtfully reflects our core values and illustrates how our community is rallying for what matters to us -- life, family, and innovation!

A DAY IN THE LIFE OF A D4D DOG-IN-TRAINING

We're giving you a special inside look at what our life-saving dogs do and learn everyday! D4D has an exciting and comprehensive training program, and thanks to our dedicated Canine Training Partners (CTPs), our dogs never stay in kennels. During their 3-4 months of training, they live at night and during the weekends with our CTPs, who also transport the dogs to and from our training center. Our CTPs help our dogs-in-training receive the happiest, healthiest, and most social life possible!

A DAY IN THE LIFE

Good Morning!

Our CTPs start the day by giving our pups a walk, their breakfast, a teeth brushing, and some play time before their drive to our training center.

Training Time!

During the day, our dogs learn several types of training.

- Scent Training: (3 sessions daily) Dogs-in-training learn to recognize and find a diabetic's hypoglycemic scent through their amazing sense of smell. As dogs progress in training, they build a positive history of reinforcement and learn to differentiate between human smells and those with the hypoglycemic scent.
- **Bringsel Training**: (3-4 sessions daily) We train the dogs to do a non-natural alert when they detect the hypoglycemic scent from one of our diabetics. Using positive reinforcement, we first train the dogs to hold a dumbbell, and after they pass an intensive test of holding the dumbbell, they are taught to hold a bringsel.
- **Find It On People**: (1-3 sessions daily) We teach the dogs that the hypoglycemic smell comes from people, not buckets or jars, by hiding scent in special toys. The dogs learn to invade our personal space to find the hidden scent.
- Extra Skills Training: (2-3 sessions daily) Because low blood sugars can physically incapacitate clients and put them at risk of injury, we have expanded our training to teach our dogs to go get help, go get supplies, and poke (CGM alert).
- Additional Fun: With the remaining time in the day, volunteers take the dogs on walks, have playtime, and do some relaxing grooming and loving snuggling.

Home Time!

Our CTPs pick up the dogs and return home for dinner, grooming, and more play & cuddles before bedtime and another adventurous day!














We're All In!
